Report of XVI. edition of Peter Toperczer International Piano Competition in Košice 2019



Peter Toperczer International Piano Competition in Košice, which this year celebrates 26th anniversary since it was established (1993), has successfully finished its XVI. edition. Its promulgator is the **Ministry of Education**, **Science**, **Research and Sport of the Slovak Republic** and its organizer is **Elementary School of Arts of Mária Hemerková** seated in Hlavná 68 in Košice. It is an international competition for young pianists under 17 which is held in four age categories – under 11, under 13, under 15 and under 17 years of age in two rounds. The competition is organized under auspices of

the Mayor of the city of Košice, Ing. Jaroslav Polaček.

At the general assembly in Olso in 1998 the competition was admitted to the European Union of Music Competitions for Youth (EMCY), which has promoted its reputation due to the fact that each of its members has to fulfill demanding criteria for international competitions. During XVI. edition of the competition we were honoured by presence of the **Vice President of EMCY, Mrs Mária Slaninová**.

XVI. edition of International Piano Competition in Košice 2019 was held between 11-14 April 2019.

<u>36 children from 12 countries of Europe</u> had signed up for the competition and <u>29 children from 12 countries of Europe</u> participated in it (Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Estonia, Lithuania, Germany, Poland, Portugal, Austria, Slovakia, Serbia, Ukraine and Great Britain); their performances were judged by the 7-member international jury composed of renowned piano artists and pedagogues in this composition: <u>Alena Vlasáková – Czech Republic /chairperson of the jury/, Mária Dravecká – Slovakia, Artur Jaroń – Poland, Jan Jiraský – Czech Republic, Marian Sobula – Poland, Venceslava Ilievska – Bulgaria, Ivo Kahánek – Czech Republic.</u>

The artistic director of the competition is **Peter Toperczer jr – Czech Republic**.

Because the number of contestants was lower due to absence of 4 registered contestants, as mentioned earlier, from Serbia /Zemun/, one contestant from Lithuania and one contestant from Czech Republic, the professional committee had to reduce the number of jury members from 10 to 7. As a result, in comparison with previous editions of the competition the individual rounds were held solely at the concert hall of Elementary School of Arts of Mária Hemerková /1st to 4th category/.

Slovak Radio and Television has been the main media partner and co-organizer of International Piano Competition Košice during all editions of the competition.

In the first round contestants play compositions from the period of Baroque and Romanticism, in the second round compositions from the period of Classicism and 20th or 21st century within the prescribed number of minutes for each age category. Playing by memory is a condition.

10-year-old **Pijus Pirogovas from Lithuania** won in the 1st category, second place went to **Sunny Maria Ritter**, who studies **in Vienna** but also has a Canadian citizenship, **Oleksander Andriyovich Fediurko from Ukraine** came third, fourth place went to **Kristina Karlosivna Avalian from Ukraine**, and fifth place to **Elisabeth Namchevadze from Germany.** The youngest participant of the competition was 8-year-old **Illia Kasyanenko from Ukraine**.

The winner of the 2nd category was Elizaveta Maksimivna Pochebut from ukraine, Filip Rumenov Iliev from Bulgaria came second, Izabelé Orlaitè from Lithuania finished third, fourth place went to Filip Prievalský from Slovakia (Banská Bystrica), and fifth place to Lisa-Marie Ehrenfried from Germany.

In the 3rd category only 4 contestants qualified for the second round; the winner was **Roman Andriyovich Fediurko from Ukraine**, an outstanding talent with excellent music presentation who also became the absolute winner of XVI. edition of the competition and received EMCY prize and the prize of the State Philharmonic of Košice, second place went to **Pavol Bohdan Zápotočný from Slovakia (Martin)**, **Angel Dimitrov Yalachkov from Bulgraia** came third, and fourth place went to **Lara Arbajter from Serbia**.

The winner of the 4th category was Eryk Parchański from Poland, Piotr Orlow also from Poland came second, third place went to Eliška Tkadlčíková from Czech Republic, fourth place went to Sofia Khvichia from Estonia, and fifth place to David Ruivo Craveiro from Portugal.

The absolute winner of XVI. edition of the competition was Roman Andriyovich Fediurko from Ukraine, 1st place in 3rd category.

It deservedly belongs among most significant competitions in Slovakia and in Europe.
